

Please pray for the repose of the soul of Msgr Bernard Powers. Msgr Powers entered eternal life on Friday, October 25th at the Carmel Home in Owensboro.

Msgr Powers was 98 years old and had been a priest for 72 years – and a monsignor for 52 of those years. He served at numerous parishes around the diocese, and also served as a teacher, a writer, a retreat director, confessor to the Passionist Nuns and Chaplain for the Ursuline Sisters – and so much more. He touched many lives, and his deep faith and beautiful spirituality were a witness to many of us.
